### RESIDENTIAL USE ONLY NO BUSINESS RECYCLABLES

#### PLASTICS #1 — #7

Rinse, remove caps  
Flatten if possible

#### ALUMINUM CANS

Rinse  
Flatten

#### TIN AND METAL CANS

Rinse  
Remove labels  
Fatten if possible

#### GLASS JARS AND BOTTLES

Rinse, remove caps and rings  
Separate clear, brown, and green glass  
No light bulbs, mirrors, ceramic or  
broken glass

#### NEWSPAPER, OFFICE PAPER

**Place loose in marked bin—no bags please!**

Glossy inserts are OK!

Accepted: shredded, office, computer, yellow legal, notebook, and colored paper; envelopes, junk mail.

**No** carbon paper, receipts, gift wrap, tissue paper, plastic wrapping, bound books or spiral notebooks.

#### MAGAZINES

**Place loose in marked bin—no bags please!**

#### CARDBOARD & BOXBOARD

Accepted: corrugated cardboard (must be clean, flattened, cut into 3'x3' pieces), box-board (cereal, pasta, cracker boxes, etc.), and brown paper bags. No pizza boxes, wax boxes, foil, or plastic laminated boxes.

## PLASTICS

Some plastics are not accepted even though they are coded with a number:

Plastic bags, microwavable food trays, produce and deli containers, 5-gallon pails, toys, flower pots, plastic bags, plastic wrap, Styrofoam, Tupperware, plastic cups, plates and utensils.

These types of plastics are hard to recycle into new products.
