The Carlton County Board of Commissioners met this 28th day of December, 2015, in Adjourned Session at the Carlton County Transportation Building.

Chairperson Bodie called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. Members present: Bodie, Brenner, Peterson, Proulx, and Zmyslony. Absent: None.

The meeting opened with The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Motion by Zmyslony, seconded by Brenner, and carried by all yea votes to approve the Agenda as amended.

Motion by Peterson, seconded by Brenner, and carried by all yea votes to approve the Minutes of the December 8, 2015, Regular Board Meeting, and the December 17, 2015, Special Board Meeting.

Motion by Brenner, seconded by Proulx, and carried by all yea votes to authorize the release (access) of the Carlton County Ortho-Imagery to the State of Minnesota.

Motion by Proulx, seconded by Brenner, and carried by all yea votes to adopt the following resolution: (15-126)

BE IT RESOLVED to approve the following Carlton County Public Health and Human Services Service Provider Contracts and Addendums and to further authorize the board Chairman and Public Health and Human Services director to execute these contracts and addendums:

Human Development Center – Mental Health Services

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if payment is not received from the successful bidder within forty-five (45) days of January 27, 2015, the next highest bidder will be awarded the sale of said parcel at bid offering.

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota, acting through its Department of Natural Resources, is seeking to conduct a Wildlife Burn on certain lands in Red Clover Township, including, but not limited to certain Tax Forfeited Lands.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Carlton County Board of Commissioners does hereby grant authority for the State of Minnesota, acting through its Department of Natural Resources to conduct a Wildlife Burn on those certain Tax Forfeited parcel described as the Southeast Quarter of the Southeast Quarter, Section Twenty, the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter and the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter in Section Twenty-nine, Township Forty-nine, Range Twenty, Red Clover Township.

WHEREAS, the contract with NEO Electrical Solutions (formerly known as J & L Steel and Electrical Services), Hudson, Wisconsin, for the Moose Lake – Carlton County Airport FAA AIP No. 03-27-0154-06-15, SP 0904-35, Airport Lighting Upgrade Project, has in all things been completed and the County Board has been fully advised in the premises.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

1. That the Carlton County Board of Commissioners does hereby accept said completed project for and in behalf of the County of Carlton.
2. That the Carlton County Board of Commissioners does hereby authorize the County Engineer to make final payment in the amount of Nine Thousand, Seven Hundred, Seventy-one Dollars, and Thirty-three Cents (\$9,771.33) to the Contractor.

WHEREAS, an application was received from Ocwen Loan Servicing, LLC. (as a lien holder) for the repurchase of tax forfeited property in Twin Lakes Township (81-030-2724); and

WHEREAS, this repurchase appears to be in the public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that this repurchase application be approved upon payment in full of the repurchase price.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if said repurchase is not executed by March 28, 2016, said repurchase application will be denied.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that up to \$90,000 be transferred to the County Revenue Fund for reimbursement of unallocated expenses related to the operation of the Tax-Forfeited Fund for the year 2015 prior to twenty (20) percent of the remaining receipts being set aside and transferred to parks and recreation, and thirty (30) percent of the remaining receipts being set aside for timber development, and any balance

remaining thereafter shall be apportioned as follows: county, forty (40) percent; city or town, twenty (20) percent; and school district, forty (40) percent.
